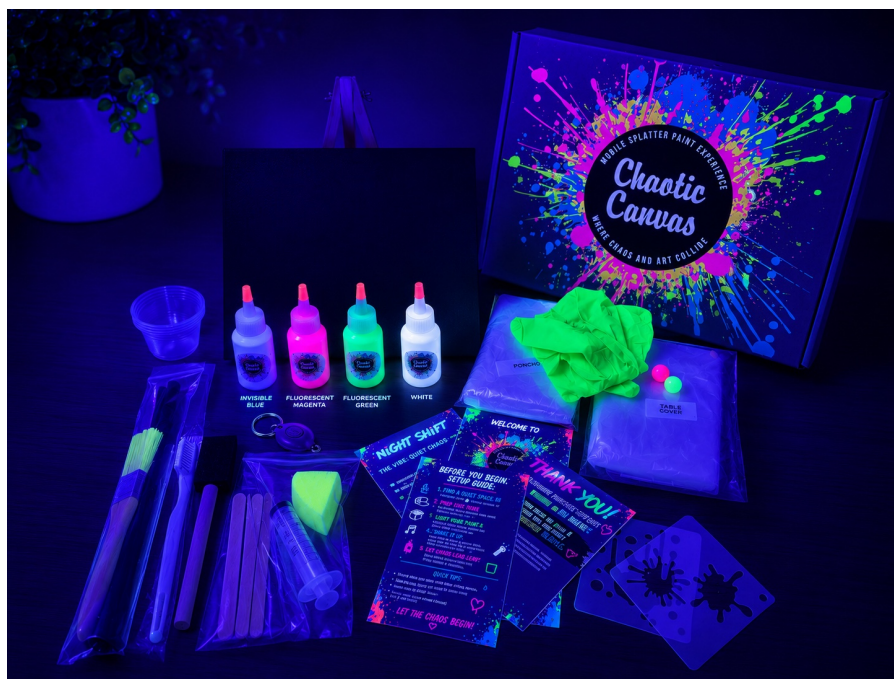

Typical In-Person Session Structure

Time	Session Component	What Happens
10-15 minutes	Lesson Introduction	Instructor introduces theme, vocabulary, learning objective, art concept, and safety expectations.
10-15 minutes	Technique Demonstration	Students observe controlled splatter, layering, masking, pouring, texture, or glow techniques.
35-45 minutes	Guided Creative Work Time	Students create artwork while instructor supports technique, composition, color choices, and experimentation.
10-15 minutes	Observation & Reflection	Students discuss color interaction, movement, glow response, paint behavior, or creative choices.
10 minutes	Gallery Walk & Cleanup	Students title/show artwork, complete reflection prompts when applicable, and participate in cleanup routines.

Galaxy Splatter Lab	Layering, contrast, stars, texture, space-inspired composition, and glow effects.
Emotion Explosion	Color-emotion connections, expressive movement, and abstract storytelling.
Spin Art Physics	Centrifugal force, motion, paint flow, and circular patterns.
Glow Chemistry Lab	UV-reactive pigments, fluorescence, blacklight observation, and visual contrast.
Texture & Motion Studio	Layering, texture tools, tactile mark-making, and energetic composition.

Payment, ClassWallet & Reimbursement

Families may pay through ClassWallet when available, or choose to pay by cash, credit, or debit and independently submit eligible receipts for reimbursement according to their ESA program guidelines.

Payment Option	Procedure
ClassWallet Direct Payment	Chaotic Canvas prepares an itemized invoice families may upload through ClassWallet for ESA approval. Kits ship or services are scheduled once approval/payment is received.
Cash / Credit / Debit	Families may pay directly and request a receipt. Families are responsible for independently submitting documentation for reimbursement if eligible.
Invoices	Invoices include itemized curriculum names, service descriptions, pricing, travel or shipping fees if applicable, and total amount due.

Travel Policy

Standard local travel is included within the San Tan Valley service area. For locations more than 25 miles outside of San Tan Valley, a travel fee of \$2 per mile may apply. Any travel fee will be included on the final invoice before booking confirmation.

Booking Policies & Procedures

Policy Area	Procedure
Scheduling	Sessions are scheduled based on instructor availability, student needs, selected service type, and travel logistics.
Rescheduling	Families are encouraged to provide at least 48 hours notice for rescheduling requests whenever possible.
Deposits	Certain mobile, private, or large-group bookings may require a non-refundable deposit to reserve travel, setup time, and preparation materials.
Weather & Heat	Outdoor, garage, or trailer-based sessions may be adjusted, moved indoors, or rescheduled due to extreme heat, wind, storms, or unsafe conditions.
Workspace Preparation	Families should provide reasonable setup space, clear walkways, access to the activity area, and disclose any site restrictions before arrival.
Setup & Cleanup	Chaotic Canvas provides protective setup materials and cleanup support. Families are encouraged to keep pets, valuables, and non-participating children away from the setup area.
Student Participation	Students are expected to follow instructor directions, safety expectations, and respectful participation guidelines throughout the session.

Safety, Supervision & Material Procedures

Chaotic Canvas prioritizes structured, supervised, and age-appropriate creative learning environments. Activities may involve paint, movement, glow lighting, tools, floor protection, and hands-on experimentation.

Safety supports may include:

- Protective ponchos and gloves
- Surface protection materials
- Controlled splatter and movement zones
- Instructor-guided safety expectations
- Cleanup containment systems
- Age-appropriate guidance and support
- Non-toxic materials whenever possible
- Blacklight and UV awareness procedures

Parent / guardian responsibilities:

- Adult supervision is recommended for younger learners and required when appropriate for the student's age or needs.
- Families should notify Chaotic Canvas before booking of allergies, sensitivities, medical concerns, sensory needs, or accessibility needs.
- Participants should wear clothing and shoes that can get paint on them.
- Students must not ingest paint or materials and must use tools only as instructed.
- Families should help ensure the workspace is safe, accessible, and free from hazards before setup.

Material note: Chaotic Canvas uses child-friendly and non-toxic art materials whenever possible. Fluorescent paints, blacklight materials, and creative tools should be used only as instructed and with appropriate supervision.

ESA Parent FAQ

Question	Answer
Are supplies included?	Yes. Curriculum kits and in-person sessions include the required art materials and educational components unless otherwise stated.
Are sessions educational or recreational?	Chaotic Canvas programs are structured as guided visual arts instruction and educational enrichment experiences.
Can siblings participate together?	Yes. Private sessions require a minimum of 2 students and may work well for siblings or small family groups.
Do you serve homeschool pods or co-ops?	Yes. Group workshops are available for homeschool co-ops, pods, microschools, and enrichment programs with a minimum of 6 students.
Are sessions messy?	Splatter and action painting are intentionally hands-on. Chaotic Canvas provides protective materials, drop-cloth layouts, and cleanup support to help manage the mess.
Do students keep their artwork?	Yes. Students keep completed artwork and applicable curriculum or reflection materials.
Can lessons be adjusted by age?	Yes. Lessons can be adapted for younger learners, elementary students, middle school creators, and high school artists.
How do I order?	Email Chaotic Canvas with student information, selected kits or services, shipping address if applicable, and preferred payment method.

Step	What To Do
1. Choose curriculum or service	Select curriculum kits, series, labs, vibe themes, mobile instruction, private tutoring, or group workshops.
2. Email order details	Send parent/guardian name, student name(s), grade/age, selected units or services, selected vibe theme if applicable, quantity, shipping address, email, and phone number if desired.
3. Receive invoice	Chaotic Canvas sends a ClassWallet-ready invoice with curriculum names, descriptions, pricing, shipping or travel if applicable, and total.
4. Upload to ClassWallet	Submit the invoice through ClassWallet using the appropriate vendor/payment process.
5. Approval, shipping, or scheduling	Once approval/payment is received, curriculum kits are prepared and shipped or instructional services are scheduled.
